## INTERCULTURAL LITERACY 1: LEARNING ABOUT VISUAL RHETORIC AND METAPHOR

Phase 1) Understand the power of an image

- Look at the following image of ice-cream and answer the questions below and take notes.
  - 1. What can you see and how do you understand it?
  - 2. Why do you think the author/s created the image the way they did?
  - 3. In which context was this image created (consider e.g., historical era, country, socio-political situation)?
  - 4. Does the image attract your attention? If so, why and how? If not, why?
  - 5. Which information does the image accentuate?
  - 6. Does the slogan support the image? How?
  - 7. Does the image provoke any feelings?
  - 8. Who is the target audience?
- Discuss your findings with others and compare your notes.
- Collect your ideas jointly on a digital collaboration platform such as <u>Padlet</u>, so that you can return to your ideas easily when you proceed with your work.

## Phase 2) Familiarise yourself with the concept of visual metaphors and visual rhetoric

- Read the following texts by Nordquist (2018) on visual metaphors and (2020) on visual rhetoric.
- Summarise the key takeaways and discuss them with others, note down your ideas jointly on Padlet.
- Search for different images that can be used as metaphors and compare your ideas with others.
- Collect some good examples on Padlet and post comments there.

## Phase 3) Learn about metaphors of CULTURE

- Study the following images of jelly beans, an iceberg, an onion, a cat and a lion, a boat and a land, a campfire, a fishbowl, and a peach and a coconut, and explain why they can be seen as visual metaphors of CULTURE or metaphors related to intercultural communication.
- Label the images with the following expressions and discuss your choice with others: *bias, diversity, perspectives, culture shock, layers, myths and storytelling, soft and hard, invisible.*
- Discuss your answers with others and collect your key ideas on Padlet.
- Carry out a debriefing discussion summarising your key learning/takeaways from this assignment.
